


New Door Latch Guard: I

want to make all club members aware that we have a new Door Latch Guard on the front door.


The lock system that we use at Oriole is usually configured to have the front door lock whenever it is closed. But that of course is inconvenient during those blocks of time when we expect people to be coming and going for classes. For some time, we have used a wooden door stopper to keep the door open. But that solution has the problem that it keeps the door cracked open wider than is desirable for keeping the heat or air conditioning in, and it is damaging the bottom of the door frame.

So we have replaced the stopper with a custom door latch guard. (Thank you Rob Novak for installing it this past week!).



"On Guard" Position

When in use, the new lock guard hangs on the door in such a way that it sits flush against the strike plate and blocks the hole where the lock bolt would normally engage.



"Off Guard" Position

When not in use, the lock guard stores on the door ready for its next use.

Instructors and other Contributing Members who are the last ones to leave the building should make sure that the lock guard is stored in the "Off Guard" position AND should test the door after closing to make sure it is completely closed and locked.






Reunited:

PYRAMID PAN DOG TREATS

Here is a way to make up to 1000 dog treats with no need to cut same up.

You can buy silicone Pyramid <u>Pans from Amazon</u>. One mat makes 500 treats. I always double the following recipes since I have 2 mats. Take your mat and turn it upside down. Now you have a mold with 556 small cavities.

- 1. Mix up your favorite treat recipe, but adapt it in the following ways: If there is anything coarse in the recipe, put the batter through a food processor. It needs to be smooth.
- 2. Adjust the liquid so that it is more like a batter than a dough.
- 3. Put the silicone mold, cavity side up, on a large cookie sheet or baking pan.

Spread the batter around so that it fills all the little holes. This can take a while (but not as long as cutting them all up!).

You can use a spatula, egg turner, or even a table knife. As you finish this process, scrape the top so that the boundaries between the holes are fairly batter-free.

- 1. Bake it for about half to two-thirds the time you normally would.
- 2. Take it out of the oven, and when it's cool enough to handle, dump the treats out into a container.

Below is a recipe for peanut butter treats I use. I have also included a chicken recipe that I have never tried as I have a dog with a poultry sensitivity.

PEANUT BUTTER TREAT RECIPE (1 Mat)

2 eggs, beaten

2 Tablespoons oil (I use olive oil)

1/2 cup peanut butter powder (I used "PBfit" brand. Its ingredients are peanuts, coconut palm sugar, and salt.) DO NOT USE ANY PRODUCT WITH THE SWEETENER XYLITOL. IT IS TOXIC TO DOGS.

1/2 cup white flour

1/2 cup tapioca flour

1/2 cup water

Mix well. You want it smooth. I use a food processor. Put the batter in the middle of the pan and spread it outwards. It takes less batter than you think. I don't bother to fill every single hole in the pan anymore, i.e., not the outer rows, because of the time it takes. My apologies to the compulsive types! I do like the look of a <u>neatly filled pan</u>, but the time isn't worth it to me. But feel free!

Bake at 350 degrees F for 15 to 20 minutes, or until the individual treats are still soft but starting to draw away from the sides of the pan. They should be firm but not hard.

Let cool a little and stretch the pan in both directions to loosen the treats. Dump them out. Peanut butter dog treats!

HINTS: I spray the mats with PAM cooking spray before adding the batter. Assures no sticking. You MUST use Tapioca flour as called for in the recipe or the treats won't hold together. Let the treats cool thoroughly before dumping them out. I portion the 1000 treats I make using a double recipe and 2 mats into baggies and

put them in the freezer. They keep for months when frozen and for 10 days in the fridge. These size treats work perfectly in a Treat n' Train/Manners Minder. Even though they are small, my Dobermans don't know that. LOL!

CHICKEN TREATS

1 10-oz can chicken including liquid (it needs to be packed in liquid or the batter will be too dry)

2 eggs

1 cup tapioca flour

1/2 cup white flour

1 tablespoon oil

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Blend the chicken, its liquid, and 2 eggs in a food processor.
- 3. Pour the mixture into a bowl and stir in the flours and oil. (You can adjust the ratio of tapioca to regular flour if you like. The batter should be a <u>little thicker than pancake batter</u> but still pourable.
- 4. Spread the batter onto the silicone mat on a cookie sheet. Take the time to get the batter into the holes. Scrape it off the dividers.
- 5. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes at 350 degrees F.
- 6. Remove from the oven.
- 7. When the silicone sheet is cool enough to handle, turn it over and dump the treats out. This is the best part!
- 8. Bag them up and refrigerate or freeze.
