### NACSW Odor Recognition Test

Oriole held what we believe to be its 29th NACSW Odor Recognition Test on Sunday, April 13, 2025. We have been running ORTs since 2011. A NACSW competitor must pass all three odors (birch, anise, clove) in order to enter NACSW trials.

We had great event on Sunday!! The ORT ran smoothly, and we were packed up and done early, which gave everyone a chance of enjoying the breezy, sunny day. We got lots of accolades from our competitors about the smooth, efficient and "professionally" run event. We believe this was because of our great, efficient and friendly volunteers. It was great watching the comradery among the volunteers and shared friendship as they set up, organized the day and greeted competitors. We had 41 competitors. Our Certifying Official was Linda Grskovich CNWI and the Judge was Jacqui Reardon CNWI. The results were birch passes 94%, anise runs 66% and no misses in clove (14) 100%.
